### During this process, we will:


- Review our progress

- Application of new opportunities and understandings
- Identification of needed changes to management approaches and actions
- Where appropriate, the offer of input to support

# **Proposed Response**

Work with the Local Leadership Workgroup to determine (a) where the partnership's priorities align with those of local government officials, and (b) how the partnership can provide local government officials with the knowledge and information they need to further these shared priorities.

- Invite Local Leadership Workgroup to discuss report at August 3 meeting
- Identify shared priorities
- Determine whether, where and what kind of communications expertise is needed to provide local government officials with knowledge, information
- Convene a strategy session to determine path forward
- Share our intent with stakeholders (e.g., Healthy Watersheds Cohort, Management Board)
