<u>Update on Review/Approval of Cross-Walk between Consent Decrees and 2008 List of Impaired</u> Bay Tidal Waters – Jennifer Sincock

- There will be 92 TMDLs, one for each Chesapeake Bay model segment, whether or not they are on the impaired list.
- Permits for non-impaired segments would still have to meet the waste load allocation as all segments drain to impaired segments
- Discussion will continue in full presentation of the cross-walk.

Review for Presenting TMDL WLAs and LAs by 303(d) Segment – Jennifer Sincock

- CSOs will be separated from the municipal wastewater facilities Slide 7
- Pat Buckley, PA DEP, notes that headwater states need assistance to develop these numbers.
- Further discussion will continue during a more detailed discussion. Slide 8
- Discharged and delivered load would be useful on spreadsheet
- States can determine how they want to account for future growth in Watershed Implementation Plan; expectations letter provides two options: provide WLA and LA for future growth now requiring additional reductions to meet TMDL or provide process for offsetting future growth Slide 9
- Non-CAFO Agriculture includes smaller, non-regulated animal operations and crop applications
- EPA provided expectation for level of detail for plans. States have jurisdiction to divide loads

<u>Update on Protocol for Approving BMP Efficiencies and BMPs to Queue for Approval</u> – Dave Hansen

 Workgroups have been asked to submit comments on 203 reports and WQGIT goals, indicators and measures; will include caveat that comments have not been approved by the whole WQGIT

ACTION: Provide comments to Dave Hansen on the protocol for approving BMP efficiencies.

- Four major steps:
 - 1. New proposals will come through the source sector work group and existing BMPs will be reviewed on regular schedule
 - 2. BMPs with sufficient information to continue will be reviewed by a group including sector experts and other stakeholders
 - 3. Work with the Watershed Technical Workgroup to determine how numbers will be put into the model and evaluate any illogical model results
 - 4. WQGIT review and approval
- ICPRB is initiating independent review program to evaluate new BMP technologies which would feed into this review protocol.

- It was suggested that attachments include list of existing approved BMPs, points of contact, and schedule.
- Entrepreneurial technologies with monitoring used for state trading programs should be considered differently in this process.
- Protocol is still being expanded beyond efficiency estimates.

Update on Pycnocline in the Western Tributaries – Lewis Linker

- Work accounts for anomalous results for dissolved oxygen reaction to scenarios
- Joint meeting of Criteria Assessment Protocol and TMDL Technical workgroups to review pycnoclines; reservations included desire for review of technical process occurring in month of January and how this would affect designated uses
