



Tom Wolf, Governor Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

Governor Tom Wolf was born and raised in a small town in York County, Pennsylvania. He attended college at Dartmouth, but interrupted his studies to join the Peace Corps and serve two years in India. Upon his return from India, he completed his undergraduate degree at Dartmouth and continued on to receive a Masters of Philosophy degree from the University of London, followed by a Ph.D. in Political Science from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

After finishing his education, Governor Wolf and his cousins took out a loan to buy the family business, The Wolf Organization. Over the course of the next 25 years, The Wolf Organization quintupled in size before being sold in 2006.

In 2007, Governor Wolf was appointed Secretary of Revenue by then governor Ed Rendell, but returned to rebuild The Wolf Organization in 2009 after the company was on the brink of bankruptcy.

Governor Wolf was sworn in as Pennsylvania's 47th governor on January 20, 2015. Since taking office, he has focused on three goals: jobs that pay, schools that teach, and government that works. Governor Wolf continues to support the people of Pennsylvania and he will continue to serve the best interests of the commonwealth.
