About the Urban Stormwater Workgroup: The overarching goal of the USWG is to facilitate the implementation of stormwater controls to achieve the necessary pollutant reduction planning targets as defined under the 2010 Chesapeake Bay TMDL and to support the efforts of the workgroup members' state and local stormwater initiatives. By working with local governments, the Chesapeake Bay Program can encourage the development and implementation of emerging urban stormwater practices to improve their water quantity and quality function. At-large Member Position

Length of Term: 1.5 years, August 2026 – December 2027

- (Note: we have shortened the usual 2-year term length to align with the other two at-large member positions that end December 2027.)

Position Description:

At-large members actively participate in the operations of the workgroup including consent-based decision-making. Members are responsible for using their subject matter expertise and professional authority to advance partnership-defined workgroup priorities and projects. Members are also expected to engage with workgroup leadership as necessary on important policy or management decisions during and between meetings.

Process and Eligibility:

Priority for at-large membership will be reserved for non-governmental organizations, state highway agencies, private sector experts, federal agencies, academic institutions, and other organizations. Nominations will be accepted from all USWG members, advisors and interested parties, and the selection of at-large members will be determined by the USWG signatory members, with consideration to their level of commitment, skills, and perspectives (e.g., geographic diversity and expertise).
