# Partnership Approach

- Build a Partnership-wide BMP Verification Program working up through CBP Partnership
  - Workgroups → GITs → MB → PSC
- Address full array of practices across all sources
  - Agricultural lands, forest lands, wetlands, developed lands, on-site treatment systems, abandoned mine lands, wastewater dischargers, stream corridors, tidal shorelines
- Factor in innovative approaches taken by jurisdictions, local municipalities, districts

- Source sector-specific verification **protocols**
- BMP verification **panel**

MB review/modification/approval to present proposed BMP verification principles, protocols to PSC

**Summer 2012**

PSC review/modification/adoption of BMP verification principles, protocols for the Partnership

**Fall 2012**

PSC communication of the Partnership's BMP Verification Program to partners/stakeholders through some formal agreement mechanism

**Starting Fall 2012**

BMP Verification Panel Reviews States' Proposed Verification Programs

# Proposed Schedule

- **Starting Fall/Winter 2012:** jurisdictions present their proposed BMP verification programs to the Panel for review
- **2013:** Following CBP Partnership approval of their BMP verification program, jurisdictions can track, verify, report, and receive credit for the full array of cost shared and non-cost shared practices
- **2014:** Account for expanded verified practices, technologies when reporting on 2012-2013 milestones and developing 2014-2015 milestones

# Requests for the Ag Workgroup

- Building on the six jurisdictions' work with the NACD, develop verification protocols that make sense for the crop and animal agricultural production in the Bay watershed and will achieve the verification principles under development by the partnership



# Requests for the Ag Workgroup

- Help the partnership identify the causes and how to address the acknowledged reluctance of many producers to share their non-cost shared practice data and allow conservation district personnel to verify practices in operation on their production areas

# Requests for the Ag Workgroup

- Bring forward through the Ag Workgroup, discuss, and put your collective finger prints on how the partnership should address these additional elements of a partnership wide verification framework:
  - Fully accounting for federal cost shared practices
  - Preventing double counting
  - Commitment to cleaning up historical data
  - Building in life spans for conservation practices
