Jeff is a 2002 graduate of Penn State University with a degree in Animal Science (Business/Production) focused on beef cattle. After spending a few years in the meat packing industry, Jeff became a Conservation District employee in 2005. He started as an Agriculture Conservation Technician with the Lancaster County Conservation District where he became well versed in BMP installation, Conservation Planning and Nutrient Management. He became the Agriculture Program Manager, in 2010, where he oversaw a staff of 15 individuals focused on improving water and soil quality. During that time he served on numerous local and state workgroups. Jeff was also part of the team that helped develop the PracticeKeeper software system now utilized by PA. That system is key in the local reporting of BMP's for the Bay Model. In 2021 Jeff moved across the river to become the District Manager for the York County Conservation District, where he now oversees a staff of 19 that includes education, erosion & sedimentation, agriculture, and watershed staff. Working and living between York and Lancaster for his whole life, Jeff understands both the historical and current agriculture environment and the impacts of regulation and policy at the farm level. Jeff has been a member of the Ag Workgroup since 2015.
