# What scientific/technical assistance can we provide to other workgroups and watershed partners?

saltwater intrusion and salinization research needs and adaptation approaches

proposal development, drafting assistance for applying to implementing projects in water/on land

Serve as a connector to regional experts

Directing them to new useful tools developed, connect them with trainers if needed

Develop or assist with training needs

Improved understanding of the two-way interactions between climate change and work being pursued for other outcomes. How might climate change influence the likelihood of other efforts? What are the climate change implications of this work?
