

## Forestry Workgroup Outlook for 2023

### Overarching Projects

  - State of the Forests 2.0: Work with the CBP GIS team and an Advisory group to conduct a bay-wide assessment of forests and tree canopy
  - Work with the Conservancy to finalize and disseminate county-level tree canopy fact sheets
  - Reconvene the forest harvesting action team
- Riparian Forest Buffer outcome
  - Strategy Review System: Develop a new 2-year workplan and revise the Management Strategy (early 2023)
