 - 4 key issues
 - Barriers or no barriers
 - Movement of a state boundary
 - 1-year vs. 3-year assessment
 - Basis for the goal (2.5 multiplier)
- ACTION: Ken Moore to organize SAV WG subgroup for further discussion and present recommendations to CAP WG.

The CAP WG needs to revisit these issues with SAV WG in January 2013 for which, if any, of the 4 issues raised will be researched and recommendations developed for criteria assessment protocol revisions.
