

Network Theory 101


WHAT'S A NETWORK?



An organizing model that enables a **community of people** to work together as **equal partners** pursuing a **common purpose** over a sustained period of time.




Network Theory of Change



The Network Mindset Shift

“To adopt a network mindset is to embrace the reality that **everything is connected**—that the actions of individuals, organizations, and sectors affect one another in profound and often-unexpected ways. ”



Characteristics of a mindset based in hierarchy, ego, or self-advancement

Top-down leadership
Centralized decision-making
Resources/ achievements are restricted to an individual or organization
Priorities: Organizational/individual profit, growth, or status
Tasks and strategies are directed, prescriptive
Reliant on systems of control

Characteristics of a **network mindset**

Leaders serve, facilitate, and support
Collective decision-making
Information, resources, credit, and achievements are shared
Priority: Scaling impact towards a common purpose
Strategies emerge, adapt, and grow
Relationship and trust oriented
Reliant on collaboration


There are many different types of networks.

Networks can vary by:



- Purpose







Project History

- GIT Funded Project in partnership with Local Concepts LLC – network building experts Christy Gabbard & Sonia Keiner
- One-year contract began late 2023, extended until February 2025
- Monthly steering committee meetings guided development of map purpose, vision, and outreach



Purpose – Why visualize a network of stewards?

Increase connections and collaborative partnerships among stewards across the Chesapeake region by identifying hubs and gaps in connectivity and highlighting opportunities to facilitate strategic connections for sharing knowledge and resources.



How does it work?

1. Users follow the [Opt-In link](#) and input their email address. They will then receive a link to a “Personal Dashboard.”
 - a. We recommend favoriting the link to your personal dashboard so you can update your questionnaire and connections easily at any time.
 - b. Once you’re on the map you can also [request your personal dashboard link here](#).
2. Fill out the questionnaire in your personal dashboard **about yourself** (not about your organization).
3. Go to the connections tab and **indicate your level of connection** with who is on the map.
4. Explore all of the different views!

Note: “Views” are the different ways the data is visualized on the Map!

Now you try!

1. Open:
www.chesapeakebay.net/projects/chesapeake-steward-map
2. Click the **Chesapeake Steward Map Exploration Link**
(top right corner of webpage)
3. Then you are already in the **Directory View**
4. Use the **Filters** (top left corner of the Map)
5. Tip: Click “Z” on keyboard to remove all filters at once, OR uncheck filters one by one

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
