TREES

- Forest buffers are currently a lagging outcome for the partnership.
- If we focus on trees, can we tie in wetlands as well?
- At the 1996 meeting, members helped with a tree planning to commemorate the first forest buffer goal set in Pennsylvania.

ROLE OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT IN THE PARTNERSHIP

- With a meeting in Washington, D.C. topics should center around the role of the federal government in the partnership.
- Focus on new funding opportunities.
- Build in capacity-building, workforce development, corporate sustainability partnerships and public-private funding opportunities.
