# Briefing Book

- What elements of the briefing book are helpful for the planning committee and EC members?

  - In the past, we have included:
    - Agendas for the private and public meeting
    - backgrounders on topics of interest for the meeting
    - photos and bios of speakers, EC members and plus ones
    - Advisory Committee reports
    - Lodging and transportation document
    - Media materials (press release and media advisory)
    - The State of the Program and Bay Barometer
- Different information is helpful for different levels. Planning committee members are more likely to read detailed information than EC members. Plus-ones are sometimes more up to date on issues because they take part in PSC meetings.
- It is best if materials for EC members are less than one page.
- Planning committee members tend to brief EC members on how they should react to a specific issue rather than expecting them to read the full backgrounder.
   Are the backgrounders something we could omit this year?
- Using hyperlinks might be a good way to reduce workload.
- This year, the Chesapeake Bay Program's Communication Office will publish a State of the Program and Bay Barometer in time for the EC meeting.
- EPA is drafting an invitation letter.
