

 - Flooding—what specifically do we need to consider to make the Bay and watershed more resilient to more frequent flooding?
 - Sea level rise—what are the expected impacts on marshes (high and low) due to sea level rise and what management approaches should we consider?
 - More frequent and heavier rainfall—how might that impact species, pollution, etc. and how might we manage for that?

2025 AND BEYOND: RESTORATION

- What progress have we made in achieving our Outcomes?
- Which will likely be met, which won't and why?
- What are the implications (risk of not achieving, urgency, etc.)
- How do we prioritize our time until 2025?
- Start/stop/continue exercise based on criteria developed from current progress, priority for the partnership's assistance, science results

2025 AND BEYOND: PARTNERSHIP

- Are we organized correctly?
- Do we have all voices represented? How?
- Who will continue to be a principal partner and what does that mean?
- How do we more formally determine who is a partner?
