• Beyond 2025 document

- If we want to look to 2025, we should talk about continued progress and how we can position ourselves to recalibrate in 2025, rather than focusing on the recalibration.
- We need to focus attention on 2025 first and mention that there are other things we can address at a later date.
- We can separate the goals into two years. The first year can focus on how to stay focused and achieve our 2025 goals. The second year can focus on what to do beyond 2025.
- With climate change and new science, we need to think about how we will move forward while also focusing on our 2025 goals.

- Looking beyond 2025 should focus on the full agreement and all of the goals and outcomes of the 2014 Watershed Agreement.
- It will be important to focus on how to accelerate progress before 2025, but we can't completely lose focus on the need to step back and recalibrate.
- The plan will be to keep the beyond 2025 theme, but to bifurcate the charge to reach 2025 and to look beyond 2025. We should keep the beyond 2025 theme in the resolution, but the focus on accelerating change before 2025.
- There should be space to talk about successes as well as challenges.
- This document can be a backgrounder with talking points for the EC members or it can be a resolution, in which case it would be publicly available.
 - Given that we're less than a month away from the meeting, it might be difficult to get approval for this to be a publicly available document.
 - There's definitely not time for signatures, but a resolution doesn't need signatures.
 - Even though a resolution doesn't require signatures, it does require approval by EC members.
- Change the wording from "within a year" to "by the 2023 EC meeting" so that we're not stuck if the meeting is at a different time in the year in 2023 and 2024.
- Change "in all three areas" in the last sentence to "science, restoration and partnership."
