January 1, 2024 – December 31, 2025 Conowingo WIP Programmatic and Numeric Two-Year Milestones

The Conowingo Watershed Implementation Plan (CWIP) will reduce nitrogen delivered to the Chesapeake Bay by 6.7-million pounds per year. The final CWIP was approved by the Principals Staff Committee in September 2021. This document builds upon the 2022/2023 milestones and develops the 2024/2025 milestones to implement the CWIP. Understanding that CWIP implementation is a collaborative, innovative and phased approach, the CWIP Steering Committee has developed consensus-based milestones that focus on building implementation capacity, expanding partnerships, and fostering innovations intended to complement jurisdictional WIPs and accelerate Chesapeake Bay restoration overall.
