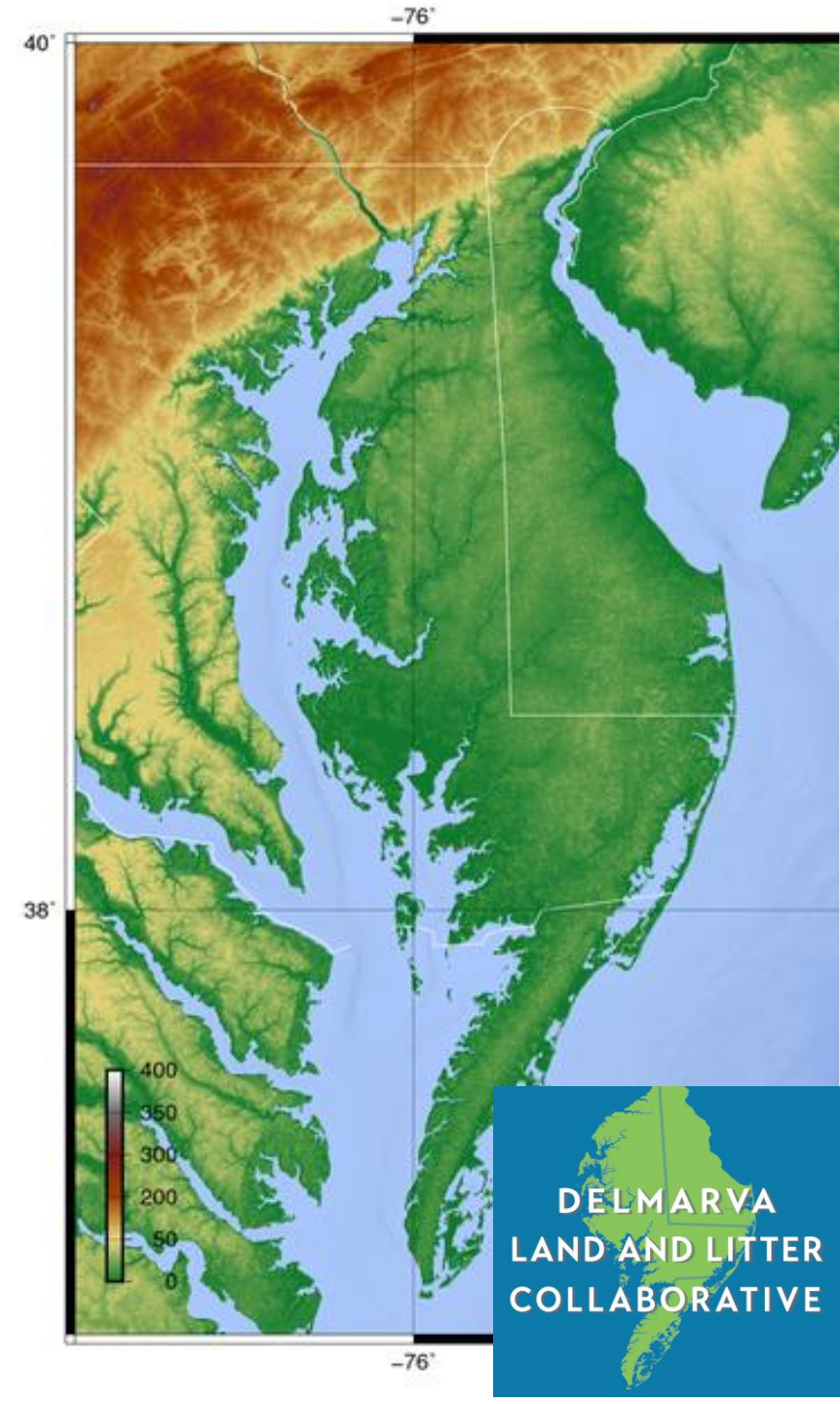


Delmarva Land and Litter Collaborative

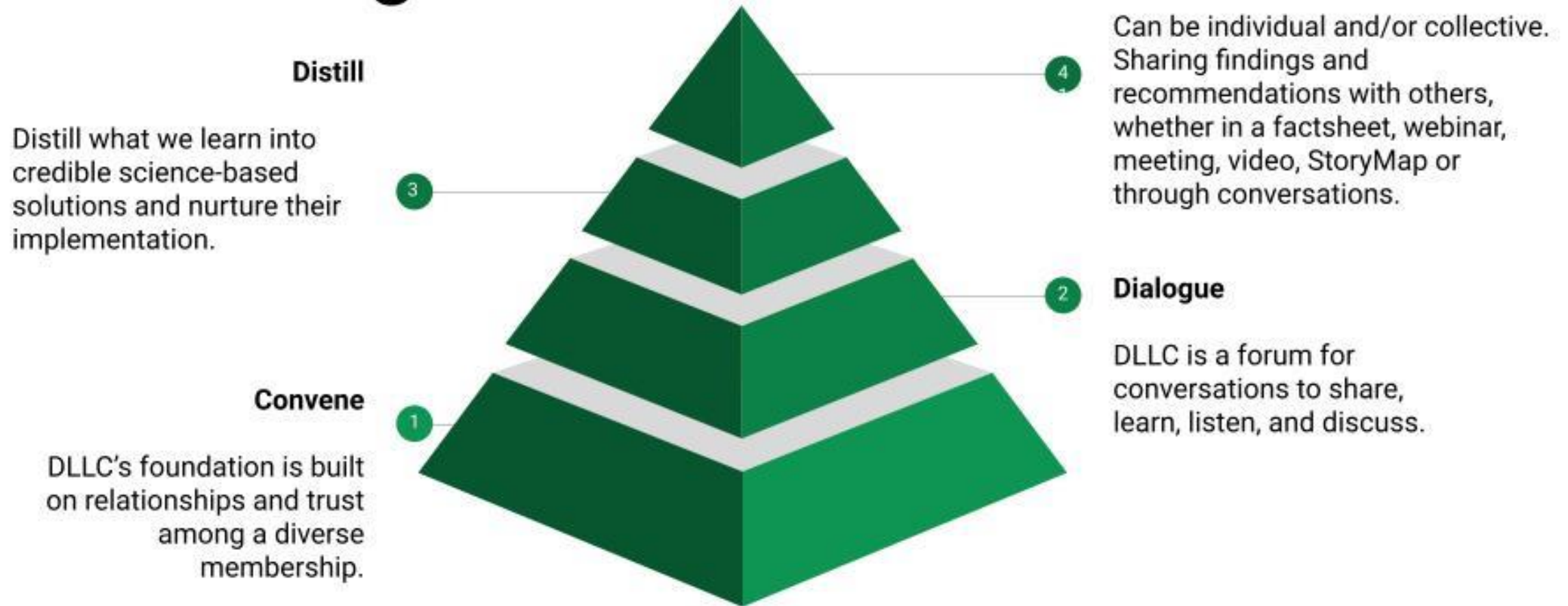
