Update on the Targets under the new Healthy Forests and Trees Outcome – *Katie Brownson (USFS, FWG Coordinator)*

Katie will lead a discussion on potential updates to targets under the Healthy forests and Trees Outcome based on public feedback and discussions with workgroup members. Revisions to the targets will be proposed for the Management Board to consider at their retreat 9/30-10/2.

Current Draft Outcome Language:

Conserve and restore forests and tree cover to maximize benefits for water quality, habitat and people throughout the watershed, with a particular focus on riparian areas and communities.

Draft Target Language:

- Tree Canopy: Reduce the loss of existing canopy, and plant and maintain 35,000 acres of community trees by 2035 to achieve a net gain in canopy over the long-term.
- Forest Buffers: Reduce the loss of existing buffers, and plant and maintain 7,500 acres of forest buffers annually to achieve no less than 71% riparian forest cover by 2035 and 75% riparian forest cover over the long-term
- Forest Conservation: Achieve a net gain in forests over the long term by reducing the rate of forest loss by conversion to other land uses by 33%, permanently protecting a total of 8.2/8.5 million acres of forested lands, and planting and maintaining 155,000 acres of new forests by 2035

Please note: The Forest Conservation draft language above is adjusted from the original draft language proposed by the FWG voting members on 8/21 following the 9/2 Protected Lands meeting when it was proposed to move the forest target under the Protected Lands target underneath our Healthy Forests and Trees outcome (the language that was suggested after the 9/2 meeting is highlighted in red)
