A Declaration of Tribal Nations as Sovereign Governments Committed to the Protection and Restoration of Ancestral Lands and Waters through the Chesapeake Bay Program Partnership ICC Resolution signed by the 7 Federally Recognized Tribes, calls for:

- (1) Include the Indigenous Conservation Council as a signatory to the revised Chesapeake Bay
 - Watershed Agreement to support Tribal Nations in their right to exercise our treaty rights and serve as full partners in its protection and restoration;
- (2) Establish and fund an Indigenous Guardianship Program as a priority within the Agreement's revised goals and strategies that would direct funding to the ICC as a new jurisdictional Signatory partner to be sub-granted to Tribal Nation members to build their tribal capacity; and,
- (3) Establish an Advisory Committee for Tribal Nations within the Chesapeake Bay Program structure to guide this new Indigenous Guardianship Program to be on par with internationally recognized initiatives.
