decision frameworks at the local level and across regional entities, cost of plan updates, outreach, and education. What are the opportunities or needs regarding to financing and capacity building? Members are asked to come prepared to discuss their current programs and policies for assisting local governments to integrate watershed protection into local planning efforts. Members are also requested to think about what questions they may have related to financing opportunities and barriers to accessing funding for watershed protection.
