- Executive Order issued April 28, 2025
- Purpose:
 - Address 'overregulation' of American seafood industries
 - Level playing field benefitting foreign seafood
 - Modernize fisheries data collection
 - Combat illegal fishing

Restoring American Seafood Competitiveness

- Possible application to blue catfish:
 - Sec. 4(a) "immediately consider suspending, revising, or rescinding regulations that overly burden... **fish processing industries** at the fishery-specific level."
 - Sec. 4(c) "...pursue additional direct public engagement to ensure executive departments and agencies are focusing core fisheries management... to support priorities needs that **support the Nation's seafood supply chain**."
 - Sec. 4(d) "... develop and implement an **America First Seafood Strategy** to **promote production, marketing, sale and export** of United States fishery... products and strengthen domestic processing capacity."
 - Sec. 4(d) "...accelerate the Department of Agriculture's efforts to educate
 American consumers about the health benefits of seafood and increase
 seafood purchases in nutrition programs."

Maryland Legislative Update

- Two blue catfish bills introduced in 2025 legislative session
 - SB186/HB446 Commercial Blue and Flathead Catfish Finfish Trotline License – Prohibited Regulations
 - SB960/HB1249 Blue Catfish Population Control
- Final Outcome
 - SB186/HB446 Invasive Blue Catfish Pilot Program
 - Electrofishing
 - Bay Bridge restrictions
 - Recreational/commercial

Virginia Legislative Update

- Two blue catfish bills introduced in 2025 legislative session
 - HB2335 Blue catfish; digital free fishing license program, sunset.
 - HB2782 Blue catfish; Board of Wildlife Resources shall amend 4VAC15-320-25, Creel and length limits. remove the one-fish daily limit for blue catfish longer than 32 inches in the Commonwealth.
- Final Outcome
 - HB2335 failed
 - HB2782 vetoed by the Governor
