## Management Strategy (MS) Placeholders


- MS development period
  - Within <u>X timeframe</u> (previously "one year") of the revision of the Chesapeake Bay Watershed Agreement, the Chesapeake Bay Program's Goal Implementation Teams will update or develop Management Strategies for the Outcomes that support the Goals of this Watershed Agreement.

#### **MS Placeholders**

#### MS implementation and evaluation period

- Management Strategies, which are aimed at implementing Outcomes, identify participating signatories and other stakeholders, including local governments and nonprofit organizations, and will be implemented in <u>X-year</u> (previously "2-year") periods.
- The signatories and other partners shall thereafter update and/or modify such commitments every <u>X</u> (previously "2") years.
- Goal Implementation Teams will re-evaluate <u>with X frequency</u>
   (previously "biennially") and update strategies as necessary, with attention to changing environmental and economic conditions.


### 2040 Time horizon During Evaluation period, work continues, at reduced capacity
