## Motion submitted by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to the Management Board of the Chesapeake Bay Program partnership

WHEREAS, the Chesapeake Bay Program (CBP) partners have been discussing modification of the current water quality accountability tools and the development and/or adoption of additional accountability mechanisms to help reach the Goals and Outcomes identified in the 2014 Bay Agreement; and

WHEREAS, collectively the members of the CBP partnership are not on track to meet several of the goals and outcomes set by the CBP partnership; and

WHEREAS, with respect to the water quality goals and outcomes, the partners are not on track to meet the nitrogen and phosphorus goals either watershed-wide or in the agriculture, developed, septic, and natural sectors;

WHEREAS, achieving the partnership's targets in sectors largely composed of nonpoint sources has been a particular challenge;

WHEREAS, in the EPA's September 15, 2023 response to Final Report No. 23-E-0023 issued by the EPA Office of Inspector General regarding the CBP partnership's accountability framework and EPA's role in that framework, EPA committed to make a motion to the Management Board,

NOW, HEREBY, EPA respectfully submits the following Motion:

- 1. Proposing that the CBP partnership develop a strategy to address nonpoint sources of pollution in the Chesapeake Bay watershed; and
- 2. Proposing that the CBP partnership develop additional measure(s) for nonpoint source reductions beyond the existing Accountability Framework and other public accountability tools.
