## NTN Funding

- We have a method to join tabular information for each site from 1) USGS (i.e., SIFTA, 2) EPA (i.e., 117e statements of work, and 3) funding information from each jurisdiction
  - Finalizing how to roll these data up into a table that can be easily queried
- Mark and Kaylyn met with MD DNR to better understand their funding breakdown and fill in our MD gaps
  - MD funding is just about finalized
- Planning on meeting with PA DEP to better understand their funding breakdown in the next few weeks
  - VA DEQ will be on deck

# Small Ag Watershed Monitoring

#### Delaware

- Mark, Alex, and Kaylyn met with DE NRCS in mid-May. DE NRCS has agreed to support a small, agricultural watershed monitoring site in DE for the next five years, starting with this fiscal year
- Site selection conversations are ongoing between NRCS, DDA, DNREC, USGS, and EPA but the Nanticoke or Marshyhope look promising in terms of existing research

### Maryland

- Mark, Alex, and Kaylyn met with MD NRCS and MDA two weeks ago. Both groups are supportive of this work.
- If a National Water Quality Initiative (NWQI) site is selected, MD NRCS might be able to access additional support funds
- MD NRCS is looking if they can support these efforts this fiscal year. If the timing is too tight, an agreement will be entered into starting next fiscal year

#### Pennsylvania

- John has continued discussions with PA DEP. Current discussions are ongoing with PA DEP, USGS (John, Mark, Peter) and EPA (Lee and Kaylyn). PA DEP is supportive of this effort.
- Hammer Creek looks like a potential site to leverage existing resources from PA DEP. Potentially looking a at a second site in PA
