In the 2022 Stakeholders' Committee report of recommendations to the Executive Council (EC), the Committee requested that the EC prioritize watershed recovery in the next two years. They recommended hiring additional agency staff to enforce existing regulations which are key to achieving the 2025 goals, verify BMPs to be sure they are achieving the expected pollution reductions, target priority practices which have co-benefits, and provide additional technical assistance to farmers, landowners and localities for implementation of best practices.

- Are there new approaches, new staffing, funding, or targeting that VA anticipates undertaking in the near term to accelerate progress as the 2025 deadline nears?
- Can you provide an assessment of how realistic the 2025 deadline is for Virginia to meet or exceed VA's TMDL water quality targets?
- The 'Charting a Course to 2025' report states that the wetlands and forest buffers outcomes are off course. What challenges has Virginia experienced in advancing these outcomes and how does the Commonwealth anticipate addressing them?
- How does Virginia envision a Watershed Agreement beyond 2025?
 - Are there some elements that worked well that should be continued or some that didn't?
 - Which of the many commitments in the 2014 Watershed Agreement is Virginia most proud of having advanced or met? What contributed to those successes?
