

#### Recommendation 1

Review and revise the accountability framework (i.e. how the partnership tracks progress) in order to empower partners across the watershed to innovate, identify, and address critical knowledge gaps, and document assurance and performance of management efforts as well as the habitat, and living resource and human well-being responses.

#### Recommendation 2

Establish a tiered approach to achieving Chesapeake Bay Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) targets that promote prioritization of efforts that align with state and/or local water quality priorities, anticipated habitat, living resource and human wellbeing responses, cost effectiveness, and climate resiliency.

#### Recommendation 3

Establish and promote effective cross-program coordination opportunities for water quality monitoring and watershed health and water quality restoration programs and promote use of local monitoring and assessment for learning and status and trends analyses.

#### Recommendation 4


Provide opportunities to incentivize effective and innovative nonpoint source management with demonstration of measurable ecosystem responses, target and empower small-scale watershed restoration that addresses the needs of the community, address mass imbalances, and promote outcome-based efforts.
