### SRS Planning Follow-Up and Outlook

There will be follow up on SRS and the WQGIT's long term planning based on feedback received at the May WQGIT meeting.

At the May 13 WQGIT meeting there was discussion of a possible request to hold or pause the SRS process while Beyond 2025 carries on. The omission of this from the 5/13 recap was an oversight and WQGIT Leadership will describe the correction to the Actions & Decisions document. WQGIT leadership also sought input from SRS and GIT6 leadership and will brief the WQGIT on available options with respect to a suggested pause, which include:

- A) Request a 1-year delay for the 2025 WIP outcome and/or Clean Water Cohort. The request would go to the SRS Workgroup (GIT6) before going to the Management Board.\* The WQGIT would document the level of consensus if this option is preferred by the WOGIT members.
- B) Follow SRS schedule, developing a 1-year workplan this year and a full 2-year workplan next year.
- C) Follow SRS schedule, developing a 2-year workplan this year and gaining the option to revise the workplan or not the following year.

There will be adequate time for discussion of flexibilities within the options.

  - Share alert! RFP Open Now until Thursday July 18<sup>th</sup> for the Capacity Building Grant Program. An initiative of the Chesapeake Bay Funders Network managed by the Chesapeake Bay Trust. Download the RFP <a href="here">here</a> (links to RFP downloadable as .docx).
    - Who can apply? Requests are encouraged from non-profit organizations, and tribal or local governments who:
      - Provide services within the Chesapeake watershed in one or more of the following Chesapeake Bay watershed jurisdictions: DE, DC, MD, NY, PA, VA, and WV.
        - o Non-profits must also have:
          - >1 and < 50 staff. At least one staff member must be employed full-time (defined as >35 hours per week). If a paid staff member is not in place, the applicant may substitute a dedicated volunteer position in which the individual contributes at least 35 hours per week.
          - A water and/or natural resource-focused component within their mission
          - An active Board of Directors
      - For all eligibility requirements refer to the RFP.
    - How much can be awarded? Requests are typically no higher than \$30,000 for non-profits but may be higher (up to \$150,000 if applying for the local government track) with justification for both non-profits and local governments.
    - How much is available in the program? Approximately \$800,000
