





- •"Pay": opportunities to reward 'players' beyond the costs of the project.
- •"For": Connecting payment rates explicitly to project benefits (\$ paid per 'lb.' reduced)
- "Performance": Measurable outcomes that are specifically tied to the desired outcome (i.e. nutrients).
 - direct (effluent)? indirect (proxy)? Modeled?

The importance of CBP crediting as a driver for watershed policy

- •What is the current 'bar' for our assurance that a practice will be beneficial?
- •What if on the ground / site specific measurements exceed that bar?

•In the current framework, once the 'bar' has been met, what is the incentive to improve assurance/quality?

•How do we persuade 'users' who don't have an interest in 'co-benefits' to act?

Initiatives which partner does not view as beneficial




BMP Expert panel Report recommendation
