Thank you for your letter of March 28, 2017, to Scott Pruitt, Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, expressing concern about the agency's Fiscal Year 2018 President's Budget, to be submitted to Congress in May, for the Chesapeake Bay program.

The EPA is working towards implementing the President's budget based on the framework provided by his blueprint. The agency can effectively serve the taxpayers and protect the environment. While many in Washington insist on greater spending, the EPA is focused on greater value and real results.
