2:00 Healthy Watersheds Outcome and Monitoring Needs - Renee Thompson, Coordinator, (USGS@CBPO, Maintain Healthy Watersheds Goal Implementation Team Geographer) and Angel Valdez (Maryland Department of the Environment).

This presentation will review the state's methods for tracking healthy watersheds, one of the outcomes in the Chesapeake Bay Agreement. Renee will provide an overview of the Healthy Watershed GIT's goal, where they are currently, and the next steps for future action. Angel will focus specifically on how Maryland defines healthy watersheds and how they intend to track progress in this outcome.

2:20 STAC Workshop Report- Integrated Monitoring Networks Workshop Findings - *Peter Tango,* (USGS@CBPO, Workgroup Chair).

The IMN WG led a STAC-sponsored workshop in April 2016 serving as a launch point for networking to support monitoring needs across Bay Agreement outcomes and to inform a process that continues to promote network integration. This presentation will outline draft findings and recommendations while also providing highlights of subsequent, leveraged actions on filling gaps in monitoring needs identified going into the workshop.
