#### **Introductions & Updates**

- David Foster (Phoenix Initiatives; TOWG Chair) convened the call and reviewed the agenda.

#### **Updates**

• Hanson called for updates from the workgroup; none were raised.

#### Pennsylvania trading update

- Brian Schlauderaff (PA DEP) described the Pennsylvania nutrient trading program and reviewed statistics from the 2013 compliance year.

- Allan Brockenbrough (VA DEQ): do trades occur monthly or annually?
  - o Schlauderaff: Throughout the compliance year. Majority of trades occur between September and end of November though. Difficult to verify credits mid-year.
- Glynn Rountree (NAHB): are you considering allowing homebuilders and other nonpoint sources to participate?
  - Schlauderaff: We don't have any restrictions as long as the practices are CBPapproved.
  - o Rountree: Have any homebuilders participated?
    - Schlauderaff: Not to my knowledge.
- Megan Lehman (Lycoming County, PA) described the efforts and approach taken by Lycoming County to embrace water quality trading.

  - Ridge Hall (Chesapeake Legal Alliance): in some cases we see a reluctance from producers to participate and generate credits to sell, and there is also sometimes reluctance from buyers concerned about risk of purchasing nonpoint source credits.
    - Lehman: In our experience, the conservation district is key. They are best suited to work and communicate with the farmers. For some of our Amish farmers it helped to get their local bishop on board. We have also created signage to showcase farmers and projects. We are reaching our staff capacity and hope to secure additional funding sources.

#### Willamette Partnership

- Bobby Cochran (Willamette Partnership) described the approach the Willamette Partnership has taken with water quality trading for temperature and thermal loads. He described the verification process used for credits. Oregon does not certify the credits, but certifies the monitoring reports. Cochran shared his contact information and encouraged the workgroup to reach out to him with any questions or comments.

- Foster thanked Cochran for the presentation and asked him how the Willamatte Partnership built trust as it conducted its work.
  - Trust is cyclical and not a one-time thing, have to continually reinvest in it. It helped that Oregon DEQ was on board early on. There are environmental advocates who have been getting more involved and asking some tough but fair questions. For land owners, the biggest piece was being respectful, honest and consistent. We have to adaptively manage.
  - Bob Rose (EPA) asked about site visits.
    - Cochran: Year 1 a certified verifier visits the site. Boots on the ground is the biggest cost for verification. We have no credits from annual practices. Even that cycle might be too expensive.
- David thanked the presenters and participants for their time and discussion.
