Fiscal Year 2016 Buffer Report

589 acres of buffer established by DOF in Virginia.

- Approx. 28.4 miles

248 acres inspected for CREP re-enrollment.

Completed Penn State SWR monitoring project.



2017 Work Plan

- Judy Okay and Matt Poirot
 - Get the Most Out of Your Land brochure mailing list
 - High acreage landowners first
 - Already have forest management plans or involved in NRCS cost share but haven't signed on for CREP or CRP



2017 Work Plan

- Riparian Buffer Prioritization
- Outreach to targeted land parcels that have the following criteria:
 - •Land with less than 10% slope
 - Consistent levels of soil moisture to support bottomland tree species
 - A crop, livestock, pasture land use
 - •A river, stream, lake or pond within the land parcel
 - No apparent riparian forest buffer on the water feature
 - Parcels larger than 20 acres



2017 Work Plan

- Site Prep Demonstrations
 - -Virginia Tech's Catawba Farm
 - -Augusta Forestry Center
- Increase state partner contact to maximize outreach potential. (Local FSA, NRCS, SWCD offices)



Continue buffer education at local schools and events.
